

2 FORMS OF SENTENCE NEGATION IN GERMAN

KEIN

is used to negate

- a noun preceded by ein/eine
- a noun without an article

NICHT

is used to negate

- a noun preceded by a definite article (der/die/das)
- a proper noun
- a possesive pronoun or adjective or adverb
- something other than the noun (for e.g., the verb)
